

A Refreshed Summer and a Restored Piano

Many thanks to the hands and hearts that helped to move us downstairs to the "Purple Room" for summer worship. The air-conditioned space allows for cooler comfort, but also means fewer

seats and closer contact. We are adjusting and learning as we go, with some folks choosing to listen to services from home, some folks wearing masks again, and some sitting upstairs in the lounge.

One of the blessings of this move is the sweet sound of our voices as Rachael plays the hymns for us on a Mason and Hamlin piano. This piano was a gift from Dianne Augeri and Andrew Dellarco, the instrument he took lessons on as a child, and one for which they no longer had room when they moved a number of years ago.

The piano has not been played regularly for a long time, so it is in need of some work and tender loving care. Our piano tuner has advised us of Mason and Hamlin's rich history and holding value, assuring us that this particular piano is well worth restoring. To that end, we are hiring a respected technician to replace the hammer felts and springs at the total repair cost of \$1800.

Since this is an unanticipated, unbudgeted expense, and due to scheduling demands and supply challenges, we do not want to delay. And in light of the fact that we are also about to take on the much larger cost of repaving the church parking lot, I am asking anyone who is interested and able to make a gift to this piano project.

Executive Minister of ABCCONN the Rev. Dr. Harry Riggs will be our Guest Speaker and Albert Kim will provide special music !





Devotions: Sue Shontell – prayers in our lives. **Minutes of Previous Meeting:** Distributed prior to meeting – Sue moved to accept minutes as distributed: 2nd by Drew – approved.

Pastor- Pastor Claudine not in attendance – Sue will address report in PRC section.

Financial Reports:

 Financial Secretary -Pete reports income for June with deposits to: General fund: \$12,852.51 – includes \$500 for toilets, \$340 from
Farmers Market, \$75 for quilt raffle and \$50 for parsonage roof repair. Mission: \$2,261.00 including \$170 for One Great Hour of Sharing and \$95 for Ukraine Humanitarian Aid

Treasurer- Jonathan Liu - For June 1-30 there was inflow of \$12,868.68 and outflow of \$17,030.57. The balance as of July 11 is \$40,029.72. See attached Cash Flow - June 2022 for details.

Deacons Reports -

Worship and Membership- Portia – nothing to report.

Building and Grounds – Holly obtained contract from roofing & Home Solutions, will obtain Moderator Charley's signature to proceed, work to start 1-2 weeks after return of signed contract. Drew obtained estimated for the driveway (from front stairway and lower side of church) replacement as follows:

Driveway Guys \$22,950 (no striping); Northeast Paving \$18,700 (no striping) \$2,130 for striping and seal coat =\$20,870; Northeast Paving \$31,000 to do paving of entire lot, no striping. Drew will obtain an estimate from CT State Paving. Charley brought up the thought of filling in the left front area of the top parking lot to bring the lot level and putting up a retaining wall. Drew stated and all agreed the curb appeal and safety is important. Drew will get an estimate on this project. Sue questioned time for repairs and this will not be determined until approval and finances are obtained. That being said she asked where PBBC might get the money from, and perhaps we should consider setting up a reserve fund for maintenance in future budgets. Charley brought up the thought of a line of credit for the Church. The line of credit issue was tabled until August. Jonathan will meet with Chelsea Groton Bank to obtain information. The council would need to request a congregational meeting prior to proceeding with loan. Joe asked Jonathan what the insurance deductible was on our policy. Jonathan will check policy and respond.

Richard reported that he completed many repairs within the last month i.e. 3 new toilets installed, ramp to side door, relief valve on furnace, and brush clean-up around parsonage. Joe gave a special thank you for the work done. Richard also brought up that a wet dry vacumn was needed, the windows in the parsonage basement need repair/replacement, and the steeple windows were still in need of repair.

Finance and Stewardship- Patti reports that balances in Ameriprise and ABEC are the same as last month. She just received letter that 5.415 shares of stock were sold to cover \$62 handling fees; this will be reflected in next months' numbers. The Memorial fund has a balance of \$30,204.50. Letter was sent to ABEC authorizing signatures for renewal of contract.

Education and Discipleship - Joe has no new events to report, although he was a tad late and broke the law getting to the meeting tonight, went 37 in a 25mph zone.

Benevolence - Marilyn reports fund opening of \$426.93, deposits of \$62 for a current balance of \$488.93.

**Mission and Outreach*- Diane reported that \$170 was collected for OGHS and \$95 for Ukraine relief. Tools of Hope will be our September mission collection.1352 prayer shawls have been given out. Yarn is needed to be purchased. A motion was made by Marilyn and seconded by Joe that \$100 be taken from the general fund for purchase of yarn. Motion passed. Pete questioned that a there was not a line item in the budget (2.07) for funds for yarn, a vote was taken and will be included in future budget.

Pastoral Relations – Sue: Sept. 11 is the schedule celebration for Pastor Claudine's 32 year ordination and her 20 years at PBBC. The celebration will be part of the regular service. Harry Riggs will be conducting service that day. Refreshments will be provided after conclusion of service. Barbara Dixson of MAEC to attend also.

The fair market of the parsonage of needs to be updated, Richard will look into, also Pastor Claudine has requested that the parsonage kitchen be updated in the future.

Hospitality and Special Events – no report.

Nominating Committee -Richard – still looking for Lou Sherman replacement.

Old Business – Electronic voting and discussed. Joe had sent out information to be reviewed. Some council member did not receive it, therefore a complete discussion could not be held. There were MANY questions by individuals and a lively discussion ensued. Because so many items could not be addressed, it was determined that questions and concerns be emailed to Joe and tabled until next meeting.

New Business- A Line of Credit for PBBC will be researched. Motion by Richard and seconded by Marilyn. Motion passed. Jonathan and Marilyn will look into this.
