#### Poquonnock Bridge Baptist Church Council Meeting Minutes April 2, 2018

Moderator Catherine Hiller brought the meeting to order at 6:36 p.m.

**Devotions:** Li Ling Liu led the Council in devotions.

**Review of the March 2018 meeting minutes:** Minutes accepted as printed. **Communications:** Court responded the older individual of the 2 people involved in the church break-in that took place 1 ½ years ago will have to pay \$104 when she can afford to over the next two years.

Barbara said the State of CT had not paid us the February & March 2018 rent on the South Road rental property due to an issue with the state inspector turning in paperwork. Barbara was able to find the email showing the appropriate paperwork had been submitted by the church, and we will likely get the back money owed us in May. It was acknowledged the delinquent rent payments negatively impacted our finances, and we will be happy to receive the back rent when it comes.

Benevolence: No report.

**Pastor's Report**: Barbara read the below report in Claudine's absence:

"I extend my apologies AGAIN for missing another meeting. I am taking a few post-Easter days off to drive Heidi back to school and visit a college friend on the way home.

Thank you for all for the gifts and blessings of the Lenten Season and through all of Holy Week. As always it was an honor to share the sacred journey with you. Reminder that we will celebrate communion this Sunday, April 8<sup>th</sup>.

Ruth Ann Eichelberg will be our guest organist for the first three Sundays in May. I will be away the weekend of May  $20^{th}$  for Heidi's graduation. The Rev. Tim Chesser will be our guest preacher that Sunday.

Plans are still place to celebrate Burt Crooks' 60<sup>th</sup> Ordination Anniversary on Sunday, May 27<sup>th</sup>. I will work with Sandy Vocolina to prepare a small reception after the service.

Because of scheduling conflicts we have moved the date of a Closing Celebration for Old Mystic Baptist Church to Sunday, June  $24^{th}$  at 4:00 p.m.

I finally received an updated and revised statement from Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield for health insurance. Our new monthly premium will be \$305.66 which is an increase of about \$100 per month over last year. The new premium took effect in March so 10 months of the increased payment totals \$3,056 for the year, about \$500 over the amount we budgeted. I don't see the need to officially amend the proposed budget unless the Council chooses to do so. Otherwise just know that we will overspend that line item for the year.

#### **Deacon and Committee Reports:**

**Buildings/Grounds:** Alex reported Dick fixed the women's room toilet seat. The snow plowing situation is resolved. Dick met with Mr. Hodge. Mr. Hodge agreed to accept our check of \$400. Mr. Hodge considered the other charges frostovers, but as these charges were not outlined in the contract and they were ultimately wiped from the record. Brian sent an email to Phoenix Partnerships regarding the steeple/cell tower contract.

**Education & Discipleship:** Seven children participated in our Easter egg hunt held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Miner building due to the rain.

Mission and Outreach: No report available.

Worship & Membership: Lenten season went very well. Peg is not aware of any upcoming event other than Pentecost.

**Hospitality:** Sandy reported \$188.79 in the coffee fund. She and Marilyn discourage the donation and use of Styrofoam products in pursuit of more environmentally friendly options. Everyone is encouraged to bring your own cup from home.

PRC: They met with Claudine on March 18. They had a lengthy and informative conversation on many subjects concerning her duties, etc. as well as other important information relevant to the committee duties. They will meet again in June. Sue Shontell developed a handy listing of all the people on church committees for easy reference and is also working on a new church survey. Discussion followed about ways we could get the word out to the community about all our church has to offer. Many ideas were offered as to who should take responsibility for doing that. Sue Shontell offered to develop and update a Facebook page. Brian offered to work with her on it. Mei Ling suggested we update our visitor cards to request email addresses rather than phone numbers and made a motion to develop new cards. Brian amended the motion to review the current cards for ways to update the cards. Council agreed. Mei Ling will discuss with Marilyn Benson.

Nominating committee: Pat is still seeking someone to fill the Clerk position.

#### **Old Business:**

**Finance committee:** Catherine would like to ask the finance committee to 1) develop a guide for auditors to use when reviewing the books and 2) revise the by-laws section pertaining to audits.

**Cell phone tower:** Brian sent an email to the cell phone tower people regarding the contract, and he will update us when they respond.

#### **New Business:**

Ladies room window blind requested on South Road side of ladies room stall: Peg stated she was asked if a blind could be installed for privacy. This issue was referred to Buildings & Grounds.

Lunch will be provided.


A registration form and more information will be available with in next few months.
