"The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life."


Adult Sunday School Class


We will be studying this program at our Adult Sunday School prior to Holy Week...please join us! All are welcome!!!

Carol also discussed the America for Christ Offering 2020 collection options through three venues: a) boxes, b) envelopes, both available at regular Sunday survives, and c) a basket available at the Bread and Broth gatherings. The donations collected go to the American Baptist Home Mission Society to assist Americans after disasters.

Building & Grounds: Alex reported the Tourjee's, father and son, took care of the gap in the parking lot fence. The furnace has been cleaned by Anderson Oil. The snow contract is firm and runs to April. Jeff Kent kindly has agreed to continue mowing the grass in front of the church for free. Dick Tourjee has kindly agreed to continue cutting the grass by the parsonage for free. Dick also fixed the ceiling on the third floor. As if Dick had not done enough he reported that he fixed the toilet in the men's room, also an electrical outlet, and saw to it that after the hot water heater had been replaced the air valve on the high port was fixed.

Old Business: there was no old business to review.

New Business:

Marilyn asked \$250.00 be earmarked for Groton Community Meals, explaining the value. Marilyn then made a motion for the transfer of funds, Holly seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved. Patti initiated a discussion on the cost of raffle tickets for the quilt made by church members offered at the Holiday Bazaar. Two dollar, three dollar and five dollar ticket prices were regarded by the Council. In hopes that a two dollar ticket might trigger more ticket sales Patti made the motion that raffle tickets sell for two dollars, Holly seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Holly wanted to know if there was any interest in the church participating in Groton's Fourth of July Parade with a float. She discussed previous Groton parades and asked for input about the idea.

Dick relayed Ron Land's interest in changing light bulbs in the vestry to LED's. Initially it would cost 15-16 dollars more but save on electricity and result in the bulbs being changed less often. Rick made the motion to let Ron do what he determines best, Dianne seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

A note from Catherine Hiller asked that it be mentioned the curtains in the sanctuary need to be cleaned. It was also noted the ceiling fans need to be cleaned. Discussion ensued.


